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FOREWORD COMMANDER EUROCORPS

Lieutenant General Piotr BŁAZEUSZ

I am very pleased to welcome you to the live segment of EU MILEX 25, the European Military Exercise which is currently taking place at the Hungarian training area in Pápá. EU MILEX 25 represents another significant milestone in enhancing the operational capacity of the European Union Rapid Deployment Capacity (EU RDC), a key objective of the EU's Strategic Compass. This live exercise in Pápá and Bakony offers an exceptional opportunity to strengthen our readiness, improve interoperability, and cultivate a shared strategic culture across all participating EU Member States.

I am confident that my staff, under the leadership of my Deputy and designated Force Commander, Major General de LAROUZIERE, supported by all the participating nations, will successfully achieve the objectives set out for this exercise. This will be accomplished through close coordination with the Military Planning and Conduct Capability (MPCC), which serves as the preffered Operational Headquarters (OHQ) at the EU

military-strategic level, and the EUBG forces at the tactical level.

Eurocorps with over 33 years of experience in both the EU and NATO structures and building on the experiences gained during the recent MILEX24 exercise will demonstrate its expertise in planning and executing joint operations in the context of crisis management. This wealth of experience aids Eurocorps in effectively fulfilling its role as the (F)HQ for the EUBG throughout 2025, whilst also ensuring the success of this exercise and its objectives. It also allows us to gather valuable lessons learned/lessons identified for our stand by period for the second half of the year 26. Together we are forging the European Defense capabilities.



EUROPEAN UNION MILITARY EXERCISE 2025

MILEX25 IS PART OF THE EUROPEAN UNION'S ANNUAL MILITARY EXERCISE SERIES DESIGNED TO ENHANCE ITS CRISIS MANAGEMENT AND RAPID DEPLOYMENT CAPABILITIES. IT INVOLVES ALL LEVELS OF COMMAND INCLUDING AN OPERATIONAL HQ (OHQ) AT THE MILITARY STRATEGIC LEVEL, A FORCE HQ (FHQ) AT THE OPERATIONAL LEVEL AND THE EUROPEAN UNION BATTLE GROUP AT THE TACTICAL LEVEL, IN THE FRAMEWORK OF THE EU COMMON SECURITY AND DEFENCE POLICY (CSDP). IN KEEPING WITH THE GUIDELINES SET OUT IN THE STRATEGIC COMPASS, THE EU IS NOW CONDUCTING MORE REGULAR EXERCISES, INCLUDING LIVE EXERCISES. THIS YEAR'S EXERCISE IS A TWO-PART EVENT:

- 1. COMMAND POST EXERCISE (CPX): MARCH 4 TO 6, 2025, the CPX simulated EU alert procedures and tested pre-selected Military Rapid Reaction Measures. The Military Planning and Conduct Capability (MPCC) in Brussels served as the Operational Headquarters (OHQ), augmented by key personnel from EU member states.
- 2. LIVE EXERCISE (LIVEX) MARCH 25 TO APRIL 10, 2025: The Live Exercise (LIVEX) is the second phase, which is more dynamic and involves actual deployments of military forces. This phase is based in Hungary, where over 850 soldiers from 13 nations* will participate in realistic military drills, including live-fire exercises and tactical operations. EUROCORPS will operate as the FHQ, and

a Forward Headquarters will be set up at Pápá Airbase to manage the live portion of the exercise. The LIVEX tests the EU's ability to execute military operations on the ground, integrating air and ground forces, and coordinating real-time military actions across borders.

In conclusion, MILEX25 is a critical exercise for ensuring that the European Union is ready to face a range of military and security challenges in a rapidly changing world. MILEX 25 is intended to prove that Europe's combined forces can deploy rapidly and act decisively in a crisis beyond its borders and it will test the EU's command structures, its rapid deployment abilities, and its capacity for multinational cooperation, ultimately contributing to its broader goal of maintaining peace and stability in Europe and beyond. To that extent, MILEX 25 is more than an exercise, because it marks a significant step towards strategic autonomy.



EU RAPID DEPLOYMENT CAPACITY (RDC):QUICK REACTION TO IMMINENT THREATS OR CRISIS OUTSIDE EU BORDERS

The EU is developing an EU Rapid Deployment Capacity (RDC) Concept. in order to be able to respond to imminent threats and quickly react to crises outside the EU at all stages of the conflict cycle. The RDC will allow the EU to swiftly deploy a modular force of up to 5000 troops, including land, air and maritime components, as well as the required strategic enablers. The RDC architecture allows the swift deployment of a Rapid Response Force (RRF) tailored to a Military Rapid Response (MRR) Operation or Mission including in non-permissive environments, such as initial entry, reinforcement or as a reserve force to secure an exit operation.

The EU RDC serves as a robust, flexible, and scalable military instrument, which is vital for rapid response to crises beyond EU borders. It underscores the EU's commitment to the protection of its citizens and to its contribution to international peace and security.



EUROCORPS - A FORCE FOR EU AND NATO

EUROCORPS (EC) is a multinational corps-level headquarters for planning and commanding military operations for both the EU and NATO. Since 1992, when it was created and based in Strasbourg, it was deployed on numerous occasions to the Balkans, Afghanistan and Africa. In line with the changing strategic context and emerging threats, it is in the process of renewing itself as it works on its development beyond 2025.

A UNIQUE MULTINATIONAL ENTITY

As a true "military co-ownership", EC is run by six Framework Nations: Belgium, France, Germany, Luxembourg, Poland and Spain. Together, they share the burden of costs and decide on EC's operational employment. They undertake to make personnel and resources available, according to the roles they confer to EC. Governed by the Strasbourg Treaty, which gives it a unique legal status, EUROCORPS is highly responsive in the execution of its missions. The Commanding General Eurocorps (COMEC) is appointed for a two-year mandate that rotates among the Framework Nations. EC's current commander is the Polish Lieutenant General Piotr BLAZEUSZ. In September 2025, he will hand over to a Spanish general. The five Associated Nations - Greece, Italy, Romania, Turkey and Austria - provide staff to the headquarters. With thirty years of multinational cooperation, EC's experience is a considerable token for success in the conduct of coalition operations. Its working language is English.





A RENEWED OPERATIONAL COMMITMENT IN THE EU AND NATO

The EC headquarters offers a wide range of experienced human resources. Thanks to its Multinational Command Support Brigade (MNCS Bde), it has its own material resources, giving it a high degree of autonomy for the deployment of a command post (CP).

As one of the first HRF (High Readiness Force) certified headquarters, EC is designed to serve the EU and NATO in ad hoc operations decided by the framework nations. It can intervene outside Europe in a wide range of missions at any level of intensity (crisis management, stabilization, assistance, etc.).

A RECOGNISED LEVEL OF EXPERIENCE

Designated as the Force Headquarters (FHQ) for the EUBG 2025, EC has been preparing for two years to meet the exercise objectives of MILEX25 in Papa Airbase and to be ready in it's role during the standby phase throughout 2025. Thanks to the experience gained from multiple previous deployments and stand-by roles since its creation, EC has acquired a culture of learning and training as well as a capacity to adapt to changing requirements. This experience is well suited to its role as the (F)HQ for the EUBG.

Since January 2024, ten Irish soldiers are reinforcing EC in Strasbourg in various positions within the several branches.



BIOGRAPHY FORCE COMMANDER

Major General Geoffroy de LAROUZIERE was born in 1966. He is married and has 5 children.

After his training at the Special Military School of Saint-Cyr (1987-1990) he served in Light Infantry Regiments (67th and 27th RI) and the Mountain Infantry Regiment (92nd RI). In 2001, after his deployment to Kosovo, he joined the Senior Staff Course (115th promotion) and then the Joint Defence Course (CID, 10th promotion, 2002/2003).

As head of the operations and training office of the 1st "Régiment de Tirailleurs", he deployed to Afghanistan (2003), then to Chad as J5 chief, Operation Epervier (2005).

In 2005 he joined NATO at the Joint Force Command in Naples (Italy) as J2 Current Operations Section Head.

Returning to France in 2008, he was assigned to the Military School (Paris) as mentor at the Senior Staff Course.

From June 2010 to November 2012, he commanded the 16th "Bataillon de chasseurs" with whom he deployed to Afghanistan, where he closed the French military presence in the Kapisa Province.

In December 2012 he joined the J5 of the Operations Planning and Conduct Centre (CPCO) of the Joint Staff in Paris. In particular, he was the planning lead for Operation SERVAL in Mali (2013), the preparation for the implementation of the EUFOR RCA operation (2014) and the operational preparation of the French OHQ.

From 2015 to 2019, he held various positions at the Ministry of the Armed Forces, including the Armed Forces Audit Centre.

On 1st of August 2019, he was appointed Deputy Chief of Staff (DCOS) Plans and Environment in the RRC-FR in Lille and was promoted to Brigadier general.

In August 2021, he was in charge of the international relations office of the French Army.

Since 28th of August 2023, Major General Geoffroy de LAROUZIERE, is the Deputy Commander (DCOM) of Eurocorps in Strasbourg.





FORCE HEADQUARTERS

Eurocorps takes on the role of Force Headquarters (FHQ), which will have the responsibility to command the European Battlegroup (EUBG) troops in 2025.

The EU Force Commander (FCdr), who is appointed by the EU Council, commands this EU-led military force under the authority of the Director of the Military Planning and Conduct Capability (MPCC). The mission consists in planning and executing an operational level commitment and comes with the authorization to command assigned forces within a determined Area of Operations.

The FCdr has direct access to specialized expertise through his legal, medical, public affairs and political advisors and other specialists, who support the mission and ensure compliance with legal and ethical standards as well as engagement with the greater public.

The (F)HQ is a command structure that coordinates, integrates, and directs the activities of the European Battle Group forces when deployed, ensuring that all participating service branches work together effectively. It develops and manages Operational Plans (OPLANs) and orders. Providing accurate information on, and proper assessment of, the operation, it enables the Force Commander to command subordinate units from different services.



As a multinational structure, the (F)HQ is manned by Eurocorps HQ personnel (from Germany, France, Belgium, Spain, Luxembourg, Poland, Austria, Greece, Romania, Ireland). In addition, it is reinforced by further military personnel from EU member states (Hungary and Croatia).

Specialized ad hoc units (so-called Enablers) can be directly associated with EC according to its specific mission requirements.

During engagements, and also during the exercise, enablers such as the Irish Force Protection Coy will train with us in the Papa area.







THE FORCE PROTECTION COMPANY is provided by the Irish Defence Forces. The company is comprised of soldiers drawn from various units throughout the Defence Forces and it is stationed in the East of the country. The unit has been stood up for a two year period and is on standby as part of the EUBG Force Package throughout 2025.

The main task of the company is to provide assistance to the Force Headquarters through perimeter control and mobile patrols with a quick reaction element. They are equipped with light and heavy weaponry and are supported by a fleet of armoured personnel carriers.



THE MULTINATIONAL COMMAND SUPPORT (MNCS) BRIGADE



MULTINATIONAL COMMAND SUPPORT BRIGADE is stationed in the garrison of Strasbourg, France. Directly subordinated to HQ Eurocorps, the MNCS Bde ensure all support functions deemed necessary to ease the command and control of the HQ, on a daily basis, during exercises and on overseas missions or operations.

It is composed of different units which specialise in specific taskings: catering, accommodation, armoury, transport, etc...








In the framework of EUBG alert in 2025, MNCS Bde provides the Multinational Support Element to the (F)HQ Eurocorps. For MILEX25 in Papa, the HQ Spt Elmt has the responsibility to sustain over 850 soldiers who will take part in the EU Live Exercise.

Over 280 Eurocorps personnel, comprising the MNCS will provide this support to the exercise, representing the militaries of Germany, France, Spain, Ireland, Poland, Belgium and Austria.







HQ COY

HEADQUARTER COMPANY (HQ COY) has multiple taskings inside the Brigade to support Eurocorps which is divided into different teams:

▶ Gardeners, dog team, Eurobar and Euromess, infrastucture, fuel team, ammo and warehouse teams.

During the exercise this company are in charge of various tasks which include the multinational catering, laundry, armoury and warehouse.









CP COY

COMMAND POST COMPANY (CP COY) has the task in Eurocorps of providing, assembling, furnishing and performing the necessary maintenance of the facilities used during Eurocorps exercises and deployments.











TPT COY

TRANSPORT COMPANY (TPT COY) has the task inside the Brigade as the unit responsible for transportation, maintenance and recovery of Eurocorps vehicles as well as the supply of spare parts.

During the exercise this Unit will provide roadside assistance to convoys from Strasbourg to Papa, forming part of these convoys as a battle recovery team.

The unit is composed of different vehicles for each mission. Tactical vehicles, buses, loading vehicles, trailers and cranes.















CIS SUPPORT UNIT

The SIGNAL COMPANY (SIG COY) with specific personnel from Communication and Information Systems Company (CIS COY) will form the CIS SUPPORT UNIT.

Through two Deployable packages, (F)HQ REAR in Strasbourg and (F)HQ FORWARD CP in Papa, they will provide Communication and Information services via an exercise network.









AUSTRIAN ARMED FORCES COMBAT SERVICE SUPPORT BATTALION



The COMBAT SERVICE SUPPORT BATTALION is part of the EU Battle Group and lead the multinational logistics battalion and its units to ensure the resupply of all conditions of supply between the port of debarkation and the main operating base.

The soldiers of the battalion support the brigade's operational command in the areas of supply and transport of ammunition and equipment as well as in the repair of vehicles, weapons and equipment.



ROLE AND MISSION

The BzOLP is an integral unit of the Croatian Armed Forces, tasked with providing versatile logistical support in both military operations and emergency responses. The unit's core mission is not only to deliver supplies but also to ensure the coordination of various support tasks—ranging from transportation to setting up field operations—that are essential in times of crisis.











FORCE PROTECTION ARMORED MECHANIZED BN "PUME"





Mechanized Guard Brigade will develop capabilities to defend the Republic of Croatia and participate in Peace Support Operations on a rotation basis by engaging forces of the Battle Group size of a Mechanized Battalion, including capabilities to participate in the EU Battle Groups.













As part of the Army's light forces, 23 MOUNTAIN INFANTRY BRIGADE is the only major formation of the Bundeswehr specialised in combat in difficult to extreme terrain and under extreme climatic conditions. During operations in (high) mountains and under arctic conditions, the mountain troopers often operate autonomously within the system of 23 Mountain Infantry Brigade.

The brigade as a whole is thus capable of deploying rapid, airmobile forces for operations across the entire mission and intensity spectrum of the Bundeswehr in difficult terrain and under extreme weather conditions.








MISSION AND CAPABILITIES

23 Mountain Infantry Brigade «Bayern» is a high performance, rapidly deployable and robust major formation based in the Bavarian Alps. Its high degree of specialisation makes it unique in the German Army. At its core are three mountain infantry battalions, respectively specialised and highly effective in mountain reconnaissance, logistic support and engineering.

Their specific training enables the soldiers to fight under extreme weather conditions and in difficult to extreme terrain.











EQUIPMENT

Apart from specific clothing for various climatic zones, a camouflage snow suit and climbing and skiing gear, the transport of forces and equipment using snowmobiles and different variants of the tracked oversnow vehicle (BV 206) are key. The equipment of the mountain infantry can be deployed quickly and over long distances.

In addition, new mobile accommodation systems for extreme and arctic conditions are available. This is completed by new oversnow vehicles (Cold Weather All-Terrain Vehicle) as well as new powerful and interoperable radio equipment, which will further increase combat value.












MULTINATIONAL PARTNERS

23 Mountain Infantry Brigade maintains international partnerships with numerous nations in Europe and around the world. The mountain infantry also trains abroad in the context of multinational exercises and participates in international military competitions to prevail under extreme weather conditions and in difficult terrain.

The practice of cooperation and exercising with multinational partners play a decisive role in view of upcoming NATO and EU missions. It is necessary to overcome language barriers and to get to know and harmonise the tactical doctrine and equipment of the different nations.













MOUNTAIN INFANTRY ON OPERATIONS

For more than 30 years, the Mountain Infantry Brigade has successfully proven itself on operations, making it one of the most experienced brigades of the Bundeswehr. Missions abroad have become an integral part of the military profession: Somalia, the Balkans, Afghanistan, Iraq and Mali.

Within the framework of the EU Rapid Deployment Capacity and the NATO Allied Reaction Force requiring light and rapidly deployable forces, 23 Mountain Infantry Brigade is expected to take over first rotations in 2025. At the same time, the accession of Sweden and Finland to NATO will lead to a significant geographical expansion of NATO's northeastern flank.









MEDICAL REGIMENT 3



The majority of the Medial Task Force EUBG 25 originates from MEDICAL REGIMENT 3 which is located in Dornstadt near by Ulm. The Medical Regiment 3 maintains equipment and medicine personnel for deployment in international missions as well as for national and alliance defense.










THE MEDTF EUBG 25

The Medical Task Force is to support EUBG 2025 on tactical level by medical assets. The majority of the medical forces and means are integrated and combined in a multinational EUBG Medical Task Force (MedTF) with German as the lead nation. Health and medical support cover a wide spectrum of activities that include preventive measures, military health care, medical logistics, and force health protection.

Through the prevention of disease and injuries, the rapid treatment of casualties, their medical evacuation, and their eventual recovery and return to duty, medical services make a key contribution to the force protection, sustainability and, consequently, to the morale of the EU BG. Medical care must be timely, decisive, adequate, continuous and progressive and must comply with the principles of best medical practice and evidence-based medicine.













THE MEDTF EUBG 25

WE PROVIDE:

MEDICAL EMERGENCY CARE

In case of attacks against own troops a first tactical aid has to be given to the injured soldiers within a maximum time frame of 10 minutes.

A **QUALIFIED MEDICAL CARE** has to be in place as soon as possible to ensure a tactical Medical Evacuation (MedEvac) towards a medical treatment facility of the 2nd level within a timeframe of 60 minutes.

Due to limited holding capacity in the level 2 medical treatment facility (MTF) the aim is to have a transport to a level 3 MTF or to the home country.













THE STRUCTURE OF THE MEDICAL TASK FORCE

The Medical Task Force is composed of the HQ MedTF EU BG 2025, the MedCoy and the Support Coy.

Our focus of the exercise MILEX 25 is on deployment of the Initial Command Element (ICE) MN MEDTF and Swedish Role 2F, to prepare for the absorption of the main forces and ensure medical care for the advance forces. Furthermore the international cooperation with Sweden is also to be further strengthened and practicing the rescue chain from the point of injury to Level 2 medical care.











THE STRUCTURE OF THE MEDICAL TASK FORCE

For the Exercise MILEX 25 we maintain the following materials, equipment and vehicles:

- ▶ 10 vehicles with 5 trailers
- ▶ 1 command post (4 tents) and 1 power supply unit
- ▶ 1 Armoured Medevac vehicle
- ▶ 1 Swedish Role 2F (Forward Surgery Team)

In MILEX 25 there are a total of 24 people involved, including 4 Swedish soldiers.













INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

- ▶ The HDF 47th Air Base was selected as the main operating base of the SAC Program and its C-17 Globemaster III aircraft fleet in 2008.
- ▶ The Strategic Airlift Capability consists of the Heavy Airlift Wing (HAW) and NATO Airlift Management Programme Office (NAM PO) supported by the Boeing Company and the Hungarian Defence Forces.
- ▶ The SAC C-17 fleet is registered in Hungary bearing the Hungarian military aircraft insignia. The Hungarian national colours of red, white and green, as well as the label "PÁPA" on the tails are representing the home base.
- ▶ The state-of-the-art SAC campus was constructed by late 2016 including a huge multifunctional C-17 hangar. In 2024, a new Combined Aerial Port Facility was built which makes the base an even more capable transport hub for C-17 cargo.
- Hungary guarantees a wide range of support to the SAC Program on the main operating base in accordance with the Basing Arrangement.
- The air base has hosted several significant national and international exercises over the past years and it will attract a lot more in the future thanks to the modern environment.
